However, if the liver has to break down too much alcohol, its other functions are negatively affected. Drinking too much alcohol can lead to three stages of damage: fatty liver, alcoholic hepatitis and alcoholic cirrhosis, which can lead to liver failure and increases the risk of liver cancer.

Drinking a large amount of alcohol, even for just a few days, can lead to a build-up of fats in the liver. This is called alcoholic fatty liver disease, and is the first stage of ARLD. Fatty liver disease rarely causes any symptoms, but it's an important warning sign that you're drinking at a harmful level. Fatty liver disease is reversible.

Chronic alcohol abuse causes destruction of liver cells, which results in scarring of the liver (cirrhosis), alcoholic hepatitis and cellular mutation that may lead to liver cancer.
