 Fort San Juan was a late 16th-century fort built by the Spanish under the command of conquistador Juan Pardo in the native village of Joara, in what is now Burke County, North Carolina. Used as an outpost for Pardo's expedition into the interior of what was known to the Spaniards as "la Florida", Fort San Juan was the foremost of six forts built and garrisoned by Pardo in modern-day North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee to extend Spain's effective control deeper into the North American c

Joara, or Fort San Juan, a.k.a., the first European settlement in the interior of the present-day US, was right here in NC – just down the road in Morganton (about an hour from Asheville). The spot, which is also referred to as The Berry Site (in recognition of the Berry family, who owns the land), was initially an Indigenous settlement and became the base of operations for Captain Juan Pardo, a Spanish explorer, in 1567 (see his travel route here).

Most people are surprised that it wasn't the Lost Colony of Roanoke Island but a small Spanish fort located in present-day Burke County near Morganton. Captain Juan Pardo built Fort San Juan in 1567 at the Native town of Joara. American Indians burned the fort the next year, and its location was forgotten for more than four hundred years.

Located on the headland overlooking the entrance to San Juan Bay, El Morro Fort (Castillo San Felipe del Morro) was built to protect the city of San Juan from seaborne enemies. For those of you arriving by sea today, you can see just why this imposing fortress commanded the respect of those that attempted to defeat it.

Castillo San Felipe de Morro is a 16 th century fortress. The Spanish constructed it to guard the entrance to San Juan Bay. Construction of the fort started in 1540 and took 49 years to build. In the 17 th and 18 th centuries, the Spanish built additions to the fort. It is a maze of barracks, tunnels, outposts, lookouts, dungeons, vaults and ramps just waiting to be explored.

Captain Juan Pardo returned to Fort San Juan in September 1567 to find the local inhabitants angered by the Spanish raids, and their demands for food, women, and canoes. The deaths from newly introduced infectious diseases, endemic among the Spanish and other Europeans, was destabilizing the indigenous community, causing resentment toward the Europeans.

Whatever the case, Fort San Juan was abandoned, and the Spanish failed to claim western parts of North Carolina.Fort San Juan may have been a pivotal in colonial history. Built before the English established settlements in the New World, the fort represents the Spanish failure to gain a stronghold in North Carolina.
